Greetings from Red River, New Mexico, a city nestled at the southern tip of the Rocky Mountains. Known locally as a hidden skier's and snowboarder's paradise, the warmer months make Red River an ideal destination for hiking, biking and fishing enthusiasts. If you are in the mood for history, museums or art, Taos is just 35 miles away.

WorldMark Red River resort consists of 1 and 2 bedroom units with decks. The kitchens are a little small but are fully equipped for your convenience. All decks have views of the Red River Ski and Snowboard area located 30 feet from the resort, a true ski-in and ski-out experience!

The resort is located 8,750 feet above sea level, which may require some adjustment for those used to living at lower altitudes. The resort has an outdoor spa with a front seat view of skiers re-boarding the lift and a common BBQ area for grilling. ResortNet, WorldMark's hi-speed internet service, is available in all units for a small fee.

Things to See and Do In and Near Red River

Winter or summer, there is always something to do in Red River. Nestled in the **Carson National Forest**, high in the southernmost tip of the **Sangre de Cristo Mountains**, it's far from the hustle and bustle of city life. With only 484 residents, there is no traffic and no pollution. And as the area has more than 340 sunny days a year, Red River could be the next best thing to heaven on earth for outdoor enthusiasts.

In winter, take your pick from alpine or cross-country skiing, snowboarding, snowshoeing, or snowmobiling at either **Red River Ski and Snowboard Area** or the **Enchanted Forest Cross-Country Ski Area**. The locale receives up to 188 inches of snow annually, with the winter sports season typically lasting six months of the year. The rest of the time, why not enjoy all biking, hiking, fishing, and horseback riding opportunities Red River has to offer?

But before we head into the great outdoors, let's first have a little history lesson. The town of Red River began in earnest in the 1870s, when miners were drawn in by gold, silver, and copper strikes in the area. By 1890, Red River was a booming town with 3,000 residents. There were two general stores, a livery stable, two newspapers, a sawmill, more than a dozen saloons. But a few years later, mining died off and most people moved away. Those who stayed on turned to tourism to sustain

the town. Some structures that reflect Red River's early days still exist. Five of them are listed on the **National Register of Historic Places** and are open to the public; they are the Little Red School House Museum, the Vet Mallett Cabin, the Orrin Mallette Cabin, the Melson-Oldham Cabin, and the Pierce Fuller House.

Turning back to the modern day, it's fun to discover all that Red River has to offer. Make certain to spend some of your time exploring the town's unique clothing, souvenir, and specialty shops. Then, head out of town—where the real action begins. There are so many places you can see just a short drive from Red River. Whether you feel like scouting out mountain villages, traversing the **Enchanted Circle**, or witnessing the grandeur of the **Rio Grande Gorge**—it's all just a day trip away.

Undoubtedly the most popular excursion in the area is the **Enchanted Circle Tour**. This National Forest Scenic Byway circles **Wheeler Peak**, the highest in New Mexico at 13,161 feet. Along the route, you'll see some of the oldest rocks in the southwest—quartz and feldspar that date back two billion years. Throughout your journey, look for special Enchanted Circle markers to help you guide your way. One place that should not be missed is **Questa**. Local woodworkers, tinsmiths, painters, stained glass workers, and

sculptors show their wares at the **Artesanos de Questa** cooperative. From there, head south towards the fertile Hondo Valley, and watch for the sign to the **D.H. Lawrence Memorial**. The English author spent much of his time here between 1922 and 1925 writing in solitude. Then continue on to **Taos**, to visit the many museums and art galleries and to see why this city is considered the most vital art community in the United States.

To complete your circle tour, drive the twisting Taos Canyon Road over the mountains to **Angel Fire** and **Eagle Nest**. Artists live and work in this canyon—and you can take a walk through their studios. On the way back to Red River, start looking for elk and other wildlife between **Eagle Nest Lake** (of the finest trout and landlocked salmon waters in the country) and **Bob Cat Pass**. As the area is also home to hundreds of different kinds of flora and fauna, it's no wonder so many nature lovers come here.

Driving Directions

From Albuquerque International Sunport Airport (180 miles or about 3.5 hours)

- Start out driving west on Sunport Boulevard SE. Make a U-Turn onto Sunport Boulevard SE.
- Merge onto I-25 (north) via the ramp on the left and drive for 59.9 miles. At US-285 N, take exit 282 toward Los Alamos/Taos/Santa Fe and stay on this route for 28.4 miles.
- When you come to the sign marking NM-68, take the exit heading north for 43.1 miles. Take a right on the road marked US-64/NM-585/Paseo Del Canon E and drive for 2.1 miles.
- Take a right onto US-64 and drive for 28.4 miles; then take a left on NM-38 and drive for another 16.9 miles. Take a left onto South Independence Trail, driving just 0.1 miles, before you reach East River Street, where you will take a left. Your resort is just 30 feet ahead.
