Things to See and Do in Victoria

Whether you arrive by **Kenmore Air**, **The Victoria Clipper** or the **Coho Ferry**, you're likely to have a little time to fill before you can officially check in to WorldMark Victoria. Head on down to the resort to drop off your bags (the front desk staff will keep an eye on them) and stroll over to **Fisherman's Wharf**, located just a few hundred feet west. Make a stop at **Barb's Place**, where you'll find the freshest fish and tastiest chips in town (voted #1 by Victorians for the last 18 years). Sit at the outdoor tables and dine alfresco, and keep your eye on the water—there's a resident sea lion that just might pop his head up, looking for a tidbit.

Victoria's Parliament buildings are a 15-minute walk away, and behind them you'll find the starting point for a horse-drawn adventure by **Tally-Ho Sightseeing**. Celebrating their 100th anniversary this year, Victoria's original and oldest sightseeing company offers a one-hour overview of local attractions during a leisurely-paced, horse-drawn sightseeing experience. Familiarize yourself with the locations of the **Empress Hotel**, **Royal British Columbia Museum**, **Thunderbird Park**, **Crystal Garden Conservation**

Center and **Beacon Hill Park** and decide on what you'll explore in-depth later on. If motorized sightseeing is more your style, **Grayline Tours** presents a 90-minute city tour aboard a traditional red double-decker English bus that also includes a peek at **Chinatown**, **Antique Row** and a ramble along **Marine Drive** with its scenic views of Mount Baker and the Straits of Juan de Fuca.

Stroll over to one of the sights that piqued your interest on the tour, or explore some new ones. Bastion Square is where you'll find the **Maritime Museum of British Columbia**, housed in the historic 1889 Provincial Law Courts building. The exhibits trace Canada's vast maritime history and also give you an opportunity to clamber up into a crow's nest, sound a ferry horn and go for a ride surrounded by the glass and ornamental grill work of the country's oldest operating elevator.

From Bastion Square, it's approximately one mile along Fort Street (where you can window-shop the stores of Antique Row) to **Craigdarroch Castle**. The spectacular 1890 estate of coal baron Robert Dunsmuir is a showplace of exceptional, intricate woodwork, stained glass and beautiful

Victorian furniture. Climb the 87 steps of the tower to get a view of entire city, and read the extensive histories of the inept Dunsmuir family members who let this spectacular beauty of a home slip through their fingers.

You must be starving! As you wend your way back down to the waterfront, the dining choices are abundant. **The Elephant and Castle** at Eaton Centre offers classic pub fare and multiple beer selections; the **Garlic Rose Café** on Wharf Street serves up scrumptious homemade soups, seafood specialties and Mediterranean delicacies; and **Chinatown** presents many exotic choices. Or you could always head back to the resort, check in, do a quick run to Thrifty Foods and whip up a custom dinner in your fully equipped kitchen.

Driving Directions

Victoria is well-connected to mainland British Columbia and Washington State by air and sea. Victoria's arrival points include the Inner Harbour, Sidney, Swartz Bay and Victoria International Airport. Contact WorldMark by Wyndham Travel at 1-800-953-5511 for reservations on Victoria Clipper or Kenmore Air as well as other commercial carriers.

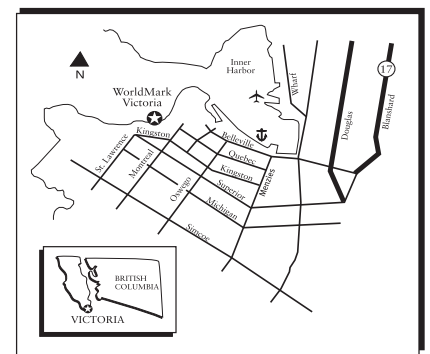
From the Inner Harbour/M.V. Coho/Victoria Clipper:

- From the terminal, turn right on Belleville St (M.V. Coho automobile passengers will proceed directly across Belleville St onto Oswego St and skip the next step).
- Turn left on Oswego St and proceed three blocks.

- Turn right on Superior St and go to the end.
- At the three-way stop, turn right and take the first driveway on your left.

From Swartz Bay (32 miles)/Sidney (27 Miles):

- **Take Hwy 17 South toward Victoria.**
- **Turn right on Belleville St.**
- **After two short blocks, turn left on Government St.**
- **Turn right on Superior St.**
- **Go to the end of the street and turn right on Kingston St.**
- **The resort is on the left.**



From Victoria International Airport (18 miles):

- From airport exit, turn left onto Willingdon Rd.
- Continue on Canora Rd.
- Turn left onto McTavish Rd and then right onto BC-17.
- Follow directions from BC-17 in **bold** to the left.
